HJM9 requests the department of public safety to convene a task force to create a statewide public safety framework that would:

- Examine the needs of municipalities and counties to address crime;
- Consider changes to the Criminal Code to move toward internal consistency;
- Gather accurate data across agencies to develop a more scientific-based model that reflects accurate crime patterns and helps inform decisions;
- Address stable and adequate funding to build and sustain a holistic criminal justice system based on the state's circumstances, background and needs; and
- Develop a public safety framework to provide a matrix to illustrate various efforts, programs and initiatives against their costs and to evaluate the proposed results.

The task force must present its recommendations to the appropriate legislative interim committee by November 30, 2018.

The task force is to include representatives of the department of public safety, municipal and county law enforcement agencies, the courts, the corrections department, the public defender department, the district attorneys, university police departments, tribal police and any other relevant parties.

HJM9 requests the creation of a task force with detailed, specified duties that is to make a report by November 30, 2018, but provides no funding for the task force to accomplish its duties.
