BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

HB 114 creates the crime of carrying a firearm while trafficking controlled substances Penalty for conviction under this section is a third-degree felony. A third degree felony is punishable by up to 3 years in prison and a \$5,000.00 fine.

Under federal law, a person can receive an enhanced sentence of 5 years if he is convicted of trafficking drugs and has a firearm in his possession.
